Where are you from and what is your background?

What do you feel are key issues in district 8 and how would you address them?

An issue obvious to many with a nose is the current status of the Regional Sewer that terminates at the treatment plant on Jones Road. I will commit to thoroughly investigating the issues at hand, the current status of the work, if anything has yet to be considered, and what else can be done to resolve the issue more promptly.

As part of committee assignments, I will also ask to resume the position as chair of the Regional Sewer Committee, where our former District 8 Councillor previously held that responsibility.

Housing is also an issue impacting our communities and all of those in King's County. Covid has increased interest in relocating to our rural municipality from larger, more well-off parts of our country. The increase in buyers from away has dramatically impacted housing affordability, availability, and the assessment value of those lucky enough to have homes. This has significantly impacted the amount of property taxes we are now paying, with record assessment increases from the PVSC year over year. I will address the housing issue by working to attract housing development to the new Granite interchange, taking pressure off current housing stock and opening up more availability for young people to stay here and live closer to home.

What one message would you like to send to voters?

I will be a Strong Voice for New Minas and Greenwich on Council and would be humbled to earn your support on the 17th.
