

Mayor Muttart Presented with Municipality's First Chain of Office

Mayor Peter Muttart arrived at the office the day before the Municipal Election that would select his successor wishing for a quiet day with little to no fanfare.

No such luck, Mayor Muttart.

The outgoing Mayor walked into Council Chambers the morning of Oct. 18 to find the room typically reserved for formal municipal matters filled with applauding staff, Council colleagues, special guests, and family members gathered to celebrate his retirement at the close of his historic tenure as the first Mayor of the Municipality of the County of Kings.

"(Mayor Muttart's) quiet, unassuming, dignified leadership has created a safe space in this Municipality for staff to do their work, for Council to come every couple weeks and make our decisions and talk about hard things that shape the future of this County," the Deputy Mayor shared in thanking the Mayor for laying a solid foundation for future Councils and staff.

Staff and members of Council seized the opportunity to thank Mayor Muttart for leading with professionalism and poise.

"His leadership created a respectful, safe environment where ideas from all Councillors could be discussed without intimidation," Coun. Dick Killam shared.

"His calm, thoughtful approach on controversial issues created a runway which launched new approaches to issues by always taking into consideration both sides of the discussion."

Muttart served as a Councillor for a year and a half before being elected for back-to-back four-year terms as Mayor in 2016 and 2020.

"Thank you for leading this Council with the climate of respect, conscientiousness and synergy," said Coun. June Granger.

"You brought the calm to tricky situations and managed to keep things light and forward moving when times got rough. Your knowledge and patience are admirable - your management style, noteworthy."
