Reminder

NS has a 10 km/h speed limit within 30 meters of shore on lakes & rivers

Shoreline speed limits in NS rivers and lakes provide a safer environment near shore for swimmers and non-powered vessels and reduce the effect of vessel wakes on shorelines.

Consider the effects your boats wake might have on wildlife, shorelines, other boaters and/or swimmers before choosing your speed.

- Head south for 5 km (3 mi) to English Mountain Rd.
- Turn right onto English

 Mountain Rd and continue
 for 1.5 km (1 mi).
- Turn left at the Aylesford Lake sign onto North River Rd.
- Proceed for 17 km (10.5 mi) to the beach/boat launch turnoff.
